	auditors. Some states use unclaimed property as a source of revenue rather than acting as
	trustee for the true owners. While unclaimed property is not a tax, a company's tax function
	frequently owns the audit. Just when you thought dealing with a state income or transactional
	tax audit can be burdensome, wait until you wrestle with an unclaimed property audit with no statute of limitations or uniform procedures, limited protest rights, and very little guidance.
