	The Alabama Department of Revenue issued an <u>Executive Order</u> providing a temporary suspension of Alabama terminal excise tax requirements. (Hurricane Ian) (September 28, 2022)

California	The California Franchise Tax Board <u>announced special state tax relief</u> for taxpayers and businesses affected by Hurricane Ian. Taxpayers and businesses in presidentially declared disaster areas are granted an extension to Feb. 15, 2023, to file California tax returns on 2021 income and make any tax payments that would have been due between Sept. 23, 2022, and Feb. 15, 2023. (October 6, 2022)
	The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration <u>issued a release</u> stating that business owners and taxpayers affected by the Oak Fire in Mariposa County are eligible for emergency tax or fee relief from the CDTFA. (July 29, 2022)
Colorado	The Colorado Department of Revenue <u>stated that Colorado taxpayers impacted</u> by Hurricane Ian now have until February 15, 2023, to file various individual and business tax returns and make tax payments. The decision mirrors the IRS decision to provide similar relief at the federal level. (October 12, 2022)

	The Colorado Department of Revenue <u>announces</u> tax relief for tornado victims. (January 3, 2022)

Florida	Florida Governor Ron DeSantis (R) issued <u>Executive Order 22-242</u> , providing relief to owners of property in the 26 counties FEMA <u>designated as eligible for the Individual</u> <u>Assistance Program</u> in the wake of Hurricane Ian. (October 20, 2022)
	The Florida Department of Revenue issued <u>Order of Emergency Waiver/Deviation #22-003</u> (sales and use tax and related taxes), <u>extending the September 2022 and October 2022</u> reporting periods for sales and use tax, reemployment tax, and several other tax types to November 23, 2022, for businesses in the following counties: Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Hardee, Lee, and Sarasota. (October 17, 2022)
	The Florida Department of Revenue <u>announced extended due dates</u> for corporate income tax filers impacted by Hurricane Ian. Eligible taxpayers that file Florida corporate income tax returns, as well as Florida corporate income tax installment payments, with original due dates or extended due dates falling on or after September 23, 2022, and before March 2, 2023, will now have a due date of March 2, 2023. This tax relief is applicable to affected businesses anywhere in Florida. (October 5, 2022)
Georgia	The Georgia Department of Revenue <u>is postponing until February 15, 2023</u> , certain deadlines for taxpayers affected by Hurricane Ian, which are individuals who reside, and businesses whose records required for tax compliance are located, in the disaster area. The postponement applies to return filing, tax payment, and other time-sensitive acts as specified by the IRS. (October 13, 2022)
	Due to Hurricane Ian, the Georgia Department of Revenue and its Motor Vehicle Division <u>are waiving the requirements</u> for motor carriers and individual truck drivers to comply with the requirements associated with Georgia International Registration Plan and the International Fuel Tax Agreement trip and fuel permits. (October 2022)
	Georgia Governor Kemp <u>extends suspension of gas tax</u> and supply chain state of emergency as region deals with aftermath of Hurricane Ian. (October 3, 2022)

Idaho	The Idaho State Tax Commission is extending the deadlines to file and pay taxes for victims of Hurricane Ian. The relief is for all Idaho tax types, including income tax, sales tax, fuels tax, and income tax withholding. It applies to individuals and businesses in the disaster areas, as well as to those whose tax records are located there. (October 20, 2022)
Illinois	The Illinois Department of Revenue <u>will waive penalties and interest</u> for taxpayers who cannot file or pay on time as a result of Hurricane Ian. This waiver applies to affected taxpayers for payments or returns due between September 23, 2022, and February 15, 2023. (October 31, 2022)
	Illinois Governor Pritzker <u>instructs Revenue Department</u> to temporarily suspend fuel tax for commercial vehicles assisting with hurricane relief efforts in Florida. (September 30, 2022)
	The Illinois Department of Revenue announces income taxes filing and payment <u>extension</u> due to December 2021 tornadoes. (January 2022)

Kentucky	The Kentucky Department of Revenue <u>stated that it will honor</u> the recently announced IRS special tax relief for taxpayers in any area designated by the FEMA as qualifying for individual assistance due to the effects of Hurricane Ian. (October 14, 2022)
	The Kentucky Department of Revenue <u>stated that it will honor</u> recently announced IRS special tax relief for taxpayers in any area designated by FEMA as qualifying for assistance due to flooding. (updated September 7, 2022)
	The Kentucky Department of Revenue announced tax relief for taxpayers in counties designated by FEMA as qualifying for individual assistance due to flooding. Governor Andy Beshear (D) <u>announced</u> adoption of federal tax extension for flood victims. (August 6, 2022)
	The Kentucky Department of Revenue <u>adopts</u> federal tax extension for tornado victims. (January 7, 2022)
Louisiana	On March 23, 2022, Louisiana Governor John Bel Edwards (D) declared a statewide state of emergency due to the damage and destruction caused by a severe weather event on March 22, 2022 (Proclamation Number 49 JBE 2022). The Louisiana State Tax Commission

	subsequently issued <u>Statewide Advisory 01-2022</u> on March 22 addressing the ability to reassess property as a result of the proclamation. (March 23, 2022)
Maine	Maine Revenue Services <u>issues Hurricane Ian filing relief</u> for those in Florida, South Carolina, or North Carolina. (November 2022)
Maryland	In response to Hurricanes Fiona and Ian, Maryland Comptroller Peter Franchot <u>announced</u> <u>that his office will be following</u> IRS guidelines to extend filing and payment deadlines for various Maryland non-resident individual and business tax returns until February 15, 2023. (October 13, 2022)
Massachusetts	See Massachusetts Department of Revenue, <u>TIR 08-19: Tax Relief for Taxpayers Affected</u> by a Presidentially Declared Disaster (October 10, 2008)
Michigan	The Michigan Department of Treasury stated that <u>individuals and households affected by</u> <u>Hurricane Ian</u> that reside or have a business anywhere in the states of Florida, North Carolina and South Carolina can request additional time to file Michigan tax returns and pay Michigan tax bills, with penalties and interest waived. (October 13, 2022)
	The Michigan Department of Treasury is <u>providing an opportunity</u> for tornado survivors to obtain tax relief. Individual and business taxpayers who reside in Otsego County can request additional time to file state tax returns and pay state tax bills, with penalties and interest waived. (June 1, 2022)

Mississippi	The Mississippi Department of Revenue <u>announced that it will follow</u> the federal extension due date of February 15, 2023, granted to victims of the water crisis beginning August 30, 2022. (September 7, 2022)
Missouri	The Missouri Department of Revenue <u>announced that it will grant</u> the same tax extensions as the IRS to assist Missouri individuals and businesses impacted by recent flooding. (August 10, 2022)
Montana	Montana residents <u>impacted by recent flooding</u> in Carbon, Flathead, Park, Stillwater, Sweet Grass, Treasure, and Yellowstone counties have until October 17, 2022, to file various individual and business tax returns and make tax payments. (July 26, 2022)
	Montana Governor Greg Gianforte (R) <u>issued a release</u> stating that residents impacted by flooding in Carbon, Park, Stillwater, Sweet Grass, Treasure, and Yellowstone counties have

	until October 17, 2022, to file various individual and business tax returns and make tax payments. (July 15, 2022)

New Mexico	The New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department <u>announced</u> that taxpayers in five New Mexico counties designated as a federal disaster area due to the damages from the widespread and destructive wildfires qualify for extended filing due dates. (August 2022)
	The New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department <u>has issued</u> guidance on the treatment of IRS disaster relief extensions for New Mexico taxes. (June 2022)
	The New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department <u>announced</u> that taxpayers in five New Mexico counties designated as a federal disaster area due to the damages from the widespread and destructive wildfires qualify for extended filing due dates. Counties in the federal disaster area are Colfax, Lincoln, Mora, San Miguel, and Valencia. <i>See also</i> New Mexicans in disaster areas <u>have until August 31</u> to file taxes. (May 26, 2022)

North Carolina	The North Carolina Department of Revenue <u>recently issued a series of FAQs</u> intended to accompany <u>guidance issued on October 7</u> addressing tax relief for victims of Hurricane Ian. (October 28, 2022)
	The North Carolina Department of Revenue <u>announced that state tax relief</u> is available to victims of Hurricane Ian in North Carolina. The Department <u>will not assess certain</u> late filing and late payment penalties for licenses, returns, or payments due from September 28, 2022, through February 15, 2023, if the license is obtained, the return is filed, or the tax is paid by Feb. 15, 2023. (October 7, 2022)
	North Carolina issues <u>Executive Order No. 270</u> providing temporary waiver and suspension of motor vehicle regulations. (Hurricane Ian) (September 28, 2022)
